MOTION NO. **3722**

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A MOTION affirming the county's policy of management of the drug system by community agencies and requesting that the Center for Addiction Services be reorganized; and requiring additional monitoring.

WHEREAS, the Department of Health, Education and Welfare through its National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) is empowered to make grants to support treatment services for drug abusers, and

WHEREAS, as early as 1971, the need for a comprehensive drug abuse treatment network was identified, and

WHEREAS, in 1972, the Center for Addiction Services (CAS) was incorporated to be the central point around which the treatment network would be established and the NIDA grant administered, and

WHEREAS, by acting to make CAS the central point for the system, King County and the City of Seattle deliberately chose to minimize the role of government in drug treatment and to place their confidence in agencies which come from the community, and

WHEREAS, over the years, deficiencies in the treatment network have been cited, but steps have been taken to correct them so that the community-based system has been maintained, and

WHEREAS, CAS's current financial situation is serious and must be resolved in a manner that assures the drug treatment network will be financially accountable, and

WHEREAS, assuring financial accountability does not necessarily mean that the county must abandon its commitment to a community-based agency as manager of the drug treatment system, and

WHEREAS, the April, 1978, County Auditor's report on the
drug abuse program and Motion No. 3515, which adopted the 07
fiscal year NIDA grant application specified certain measures
which, if implemented, would have corrected the major problems
apparent in the system, and

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WHEREAS, NIDA apparently feels that stronger measures are necessary has granted an extension to September 30, 1978, of the 06 fiscal year contract to allow time for further consideration, and

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WHEREAS, testimony before the Health and Human Services Committee indicates that these continuing disruptions are beginning to affect services to clients, and

WHEREAS, the drug treatment system will suffer further serious disruptions in two years when NIDA intends to award the grant to the state unless careful planning is done in the interim, and

WHEREAS, other testimony before the Committee demonstrated once again the deep commitment in the county to locally controlled, community-based services;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. The King County Council affirms the county's policy that the drug abuse treatment network will function most effectively if it is managed by a community-based agency. The Council therefore reaffirms the organizational arrangements, monetary allocations, and corrective measures specified in Motion No. 3515 and the grant application authorized thereby. Except that, monetary allocations may be adjusted to reflect changes in the grant award caused by the extension of the 06 fiscal year contract and to allow CAS to offer medical services. Such adjustments shall be consistent with the Council's intent as established in the grant application authorized in Motion No. 3515.

28 2. The King County Council, recognizing that serious
29 organizational problems remain at CAS, respectfully requests the
30 Executive, CAS, NIDA, and the Mayor of Seattle to join together
31 in making recommendations to the County Council on restructuring
32 the Center for Addiction Services which will allow it to continue
33 as the central point for the drug treatment network while

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assuring that it can be held financially accountable.

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3. The County Auditor is requested to proceed with his audit of the Center for Addiction Services as authorized by Motion No. 3525. In addition, the County Auditor is requested to perform or have performed an audit of the Center for Addiction Services for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1979.

4. Any contract negotiated between the County and the Center for Addiction Services must include provision for monthly monitoring of the CAS budget and expenditures. It is the Council's intent that the Division of Human Services, as the County's agent for such monitoring, report to the Council no later than October 15, 1978, on the monitoring system it has established. It is the Council's further intent that the Division report to the Executive and the Council, on a quarterly basis, the results of its monitoring activities.

5. The Executive is requested to offer recommendaitons when he transmits the 1979 Drug Abuse Plan as to whether and in what form the Request for Proposal process should be resumed in future years.
