A MOTION requesting the Executive include \$1,180,000 in the 1979 budget for emergency medical services and to submit a recommendation to the Council for additional funding.

WHEREAS, in 1975, King County began contributing funds to supplement the efforts of cities, fire districts, hospital districts and citizen groups in providing paramedic services, and

WHEREAS, it has been evident from the outset that the County could not provide all the funds required to operate these programs within existing revenue sources, which have since been further restricted by actions of the state and federal governments, and

WHEREAS, the County Executive comtemplates that \$1,180,000 will be available to support suburban paramedic services in 1979, and

WHEREAS, this amount will provide the required level of support for these programs for approximately nine months only, and

WHEREAS, during those nine months a new source of local option revenue can be developed by authorization of the 1979 Legislative Session, or the voters of King County could be given an opportunity to raise the 106 per cent lid on the County's property tax levy in September, 1979, to provide funds.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The County Executive is hereby requested to include
\$1,180,000 to support suburban paramedic services from January 1,
to September 30, 1979, in the 1979 County budget.
