2 A MOTION relating to the 1979 Housing and  
3 Community Development Block Grant, specifying  
4 projects for County Population Funds, and  
5 specifying projects for Countywide needs and  
6 Joint funds.

7 WHEREAS, P.L. 93-383, the Housing and Community Development  
8 Act of 1974, establishes a program of financial assistance to  
9 local governments for the development of viable urban communities  
10 through the provision of decent housing, a suitable living  
11 environment and expanded economic opportunities, primarily for  
12 persons of low and moderate income, and

13 WHEREAS, King County and twenty-five suburban cities, as an  
14 urban county consortium, will receive \$5,762,000 of Housing and  
15 Community Development Block Grant funds for the 1979-80 program  
16 year, and

17 WHEREAS, King County will receive \$2,126,416 in Population  
18 Funds and will share in \$1,676,089 in Countywide Needs Funds, and

19 WHEREAS, \$85,000 in recaptured Block Grant funds are  
20 available to be reappropriated, and

21 WHEREAS, King County has adopted its Plan for Community  
22 Development, 1979-81, and

23 WHEREAS, the County Council has held public hearings to hear  
24 the views of citizens on housing and community development needs  
25 on November 2, 1978; November 6, 1978; November 8, 1978; and  
26 November 15, 1978;

27 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

28 1. The following projects in the funding categories and  
29 amounts specified are hereby adopted. The Executive is  
30 authorized to submit them to the Joint Policy Committee in  
31 accordance with the provisions of the Cooperation Agreement  
32 signed by King County and the other twenty-five jurisdictions and  
33 in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance 3969.

b. CD-820-79 Kenmore Business District Redevelopment

Planning. Block Grant funds for this project are contingent upon the Kenmore Chamber of Commerce's contribution of private funds.

c. CD-850-79 Kenmore Business District Redevelopment.  
Block Grant funds for this project are contingent upon approval of the Economic Development Administration (EDA) grant for fiscal year 1979. If EDA funds are secured, \$134,000 in 1980 fiscal year Block Grant funds are hereby committed to this project.

d. CD-852-79 Langston Sewer. \$250,000 in 1980 fiscal year Block Grant funds are hereby committed to this project.

e. CD-861-79 Duwamish Waterway Park. Block Grant funds for this project are contingent upon securing maintenance funds from non-County sources.

f. CD-862-79 132nd Northeast Park Acquisition and Development: \$50,000 in 1980 fiscal year Block Grant funds are hereby committed to this project.

g. --- Snoqualmie Valley Children's Services.  
Expenditure of Block Grant funds for this project is contingent upon Council approval of a program plan to be prepared by the Youth Services Department which is based upon a determination of needs within the Snoqualmie Valley.

h. CD-871-79 Pockets of Poverty Set Aside and --- East Region Pockets of Poverty Set Aside. Expenditure of Block Grant funds for these projects is contingent upon Council approval of project proposals.
