A MOTION authorizing the Treasurer and Comptroller of King County to cancel the attached list of uncollectable personal property taxes in the amount of \$203,071.92 for the years 1972 through 1978.

WHEREAS, the duly appointed Treasurer and Comptroller of King County, Washington has made an affidavit pursuant to the terms of R.C.W. 86.54.240 and R.C.W. 86.54.260 to the King County Council relating his diligent search and inquiry for goods and chattels of the persons appearing on the attached list of delinquent taxpayers and was unable to find any such property from which said taxes could be collected, and

WHEREAS, the duly appointed Treasurer and Comptroller of King County, Washington has requested the authority from the King County Council to cancel said taxes.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The Comptroller of King County is hereby authorized to remove the tax billings in the amount of \$203,071.92 as indicated by the listing herewith presented from the Comptroller's records for the years 1972 through 1978; but the obligation to King County is not forgiven.

MOTION NO. 4171

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2 A MOTION authorizing the Executive of King County to
3 execute an Interlocal Agreement with the City of Auburn
4 regarding the proposed annexation and development of the
5 "Thomas Annexation" area.

6 WHEREAS, a petition by property owners has been submitted to the City of
7 Auburn for the annexation of approximately 240 acres of land located generally
8 between north city limits of Auburn and South 277th Street and between the
9 Valley Freeway and 80th Avenue South, and

10 WHEREAS, the City of Auburn has approved by resolution No. 966 an
11 Interlocal Agreement with King County including provisions on zoning and
12 planning in the proposed Thomas annexation area, and

13 WHEREAS, King County acknowledges the benefits of coordinating the
14 planning and development of land in the proposed Thomas annexation area.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

16 1. The Council agrees:

- 17 a. To work with the City of Auburn to identify appropriate
18 measures for preserving the woodlands, wetlands, and associated
19 marsh described in the agreement.
20 b. To cooperate with the City of Auburn through the Green River
21 Basin Program, in identification of the "regulatory floodway",
22 and in development of plans and projects to provide permanent
23 flood protection for the area.

24 2. The City of Auburn and King County Jointly agree:

- 25 a. The intent of the agreement is to address mutual concerns
26 regarding the annexation and proposed development which has
27 arisen during the course of review of the proposed action.
28 b. This agreement is not intended to serve as a precedent for any
29 other annexations or developments that may be proposed in
30 future or may be currently pending.
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3. The County Executive is authorized to execute the attached Interlocal Agreement with the City of Auburn.
