MOTION NO. 4209

A MOTION proclaiming May 3, 1979 as "SUN DAY" and May 1st through May 7th as "SUN WEEK" and requesting the County Executive to promote the celebration and observance of these two events.

WHEREAS, King County Council policy supports energy conservation and the development of newer, theretofore less used, and economical sources of energy to meet the increasing population needs of King County (Motion 2787, December 6, 1976, and

WHEREAS, "SUN DAY", May 3, 1979 is the day of national recognition of solar energy in all its forms --direct radiation, wind and biomass, and

WHEREAS, solar energy is our most abundant source of energy, and
WHEREAS, King County's "Energy Conservation Policies" "support basic
energy research and related demonstration projects in solar, wind, biomass,
geothermal and other nondepletable energy sources, as well as supporting
the development of energy recovery from renewable energy sources found in
solid wastes generated in all of King County", and

WHEREAS, Seattle and King County have been designated and funded by the federal government to explore the possibilities of recovering energy found in solid wastes, and

WHEREAS, the Council, by passage of Motion No. 03802 relating to Solar Energy; stating the County's support of the Western Washington Solar Energy Association's bid to hold the "Solar 79 Northwest" conference in Seattle, August 10-12, 1979 at the Seattle Center, and

WHEREAS, the Council has demonstrated interest in Solar Energy by funding projects such as using solar energy to heat water in the Lake Meridian Bath 'House, which has been in operation since last year, and

WHEREAS, the Council funded a solar greenhouse operated by members of the Highline Senior Center, and

WHEREAS, this solar greenhouse, funded by a \$5000 appropriation by the King County Council from federal shared revenue, will be dedicated during the national "SUN DAY" celebration on Thursday, May 3, 1979 at 12:30 p.m.

WHEREAS, the King County Council would extend the emphasis on solar energy by declaring "SUN WEEK" from May 1st through May 7th, 1979.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: Thursday, May 3, 1979, is hereby proclaimed "SUN DAY" in King County and May 1st through May 7th is hereby proclaimed "SUN WEEK" in King County. BE IT FURTHER MOVED: The County Executive is hereby requested to promote the awareness of the benefits available from the use of sun power in all its forms through the celebration of SUN DAY and the observation of SUN WEEK to achieve greater harnessing of sun power as an energy source in King County.
