WHEREAS, increasing concern for energy conservation, health and environmental amenities has contributed to the rediscovery of the bicycle for commuting purposes, fun, recreation, individual sport and family activities, and

WHEREAS, shortages and greatly increased prices for gasoline and oil products have cut deeply into the personal budgets of most of our citizens, and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States has designated the week of May 13 through May 20 as National Transportation Week, and

WHEREAS, the bicycle is a viable and legitimate means of transportation, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council has adopted energy conservation policies as part of the County's Comprehensive Plan in 1978, which specifically encourages the provision of alternative modes of transportation by encouraging bicycle and pedestrian access to work, school, shopping and other destinations, and ·

WHEREAS, for the past decade the King County Council has demonstrated its intent to provide for the bicycling public by the adoption of the Urban Trails Plan of 1971, the General Bicycle Plan in 1976, and Motion No. 3458 encouraging the establishment of a coordinator for nonmotorized travel in 1978, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council, in 1978, allocated funds through the King County Parks Division to hire a Recreation Specialist, whose major job will be to develop competitive programs in conjunction with the Washington State Bicycle Association and instructional and safety programs for bicyclists, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council is working to revise the King County Comprehensive Plan in 1979 to include an integrated and balanced emphasis on nonmotorized and motorized transportation facilities and opportunities, and

WHEREAS, the bicycle program should include the cooperative efforts of the City of Seattle, King County, the Puget Sound Council of Government's
