

MOTION NO. 4224

A MOTION allocating Federal Shared Revenue for the purpose of supporting various social program projects.

WHEREAS, an allocation of funds to support various social program projects for the benefit of King County citizens is an appropriate expenditure of Federal Shared Revenue, and

WHEREAS, the County Council, in adopting the 1979 budget, appropriated \$100,000 of Federal Shared Revenue for various social program projects, and the Executive has certified that an additional \$233,874 is available, and

WHEREAS, the County Executive has solicited proposals for various social program projects from the citizens of King County.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to release \$333,874 appropriated to support various social program projects designed to benefit the citizens of King County for the purpose of supporting the following named projects in the amounts enumerated below:
