MOTION NO. 0004494

A MOTION relating to the County's 1980 budget; requesting the Executive to include adequate funds in the District Court's budget and take the necessary administrative actions to establish a warrant service unit.

WHEREAS, it has been recently reported that as many as fourteen thousand warrants for arrest, issued by the District Courts, have not been served by the Department of Public Safety,

WHEREAS, these warrants for arrest have been issued against individuals who have failed to pay a fine or appear regarding a past issued citation, largely traffic violations, and

WHEREAS, it has been estimated that lost revenue for failure to serve warrants is approximately three million dollars, and

WHEREAS, it has been conservatively estimated that lost revenue to King County is in excess of one million dollars, and

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety has been unable to serve these warrants because of manpower shortages and higher priorities of service for which the Sheriff is legally bound to perform, and

WHEREAS, the failure to serve these warrants is inequitable in that a citizen paying a fine or posting bail, which results in the support of general government, is also subsidizing those who do not pay by virtue of the current situation, and

WHEREAS, to require the Department of Public Safety to serve these warrants as expeditiously as possible would result in additional uniformed personnel being transferred from higher priority functions of basic law enforcement, and

WHEREAS, the City of Seattle has implemented a warrant service unit under the Municipal Court charged with serving warrants for citations issued by the Seattle Police Department, and

WHEREAS, the City's warrant service unit operates under the

court, bound by procedures developed in concert with the Police Department, which restricts their activities to that of serving warrants and not acting as law enforcement officers, and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Court's warrant service unit served fifty-four thousand warrants in 1978, with the value of such warrants estimated at four million six hundred thousand dollars, and

WHEREAS, the budget of the warrant service unit in the City of Seattle for 1979 is \$339,536, including sixteen warrant servers, clerk, manager, and support costs, and

WHEREAS, the County Executive, through the Sheriff-Director of the Department of Public Safety, is authorized under RCW 36.38.020 to issue special commissions as deputies to individual persons for the performance of specific law enforcement duties, and

WHEREAS, the District Court Administrator has determined that, based on proper authorization, a warrant service unit could be implemented in King County at a projected 1980 cost not to exceed two hundred fifty thousand dollars, to include eight warrant servers, a clerk, and support costs, including initial telephone installation, and

WHEREAS, it is clearly apparent that the costs associated with such a unit in King County would more than be offset by increased revenue to the County, and

WHEREAS, the implementation of such a unit in the District Courts, under the supervision of the District Court Administrator, will not only result in increased revenue to the County, but also experience leading to the possible absorption of other service functions, thereby allowing the transfer of commissioned officers in the Department of Public Safety to other appropriate law enforcement activities,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: ,1 The Executive is requested to: Include adequate funds in the District Court's budget for 1980 to implement a warrant service unit, and Take the appropriate administrative and legal actions necessary for the unit to begin operation effective January 1, 1980.
