A MOTION relating to compensation paid to King County elected officials; appointing members of certain groups to serve on a committee to review and recommend adequate levels of compensation.

MOTION NO.

WHEREAS, by KCC 3.12, the Personnel System, the King County Council approves compensation to be paid all employees excluding those elected officials whose salaries are set by the state, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council is currently considering Proposed Ordinance #79-1598, relating to the cost of living increase for county employees, and

WHEREAS, within Proposed Ordinance #79-1598, the Council has been discussing levels of compensation to be paid its members, and other affected county elected officials, and

WHEREAS, specifying the level of compensation to be paid elected officials is a complex issue given the lack of readily available information to establish comparative salaries or other methods of compensation, and

WHEREAS, in considering the level of compensation to be paid elected officials there is a need to perform in-depth review and make recommendations as to salaries to be paid not only in the present but in the future, and

WHEREAS, a review should be performed by representatives of the community in an open public process with recommendations to be reviewed by the legislative branch, and

WHEREAS, a structured review by the committee will result in formal recommendations which can then be debated by the Council in an open public forum prior to implementation.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The Council Administrator is directed to request that the following organizations appoint a member to serve on a committee to review and recommend to the Council, by September 30, 1980, levels of compensation to be paid members of the Council, the Assessor and the Prosecuting Attorney.
