MOTION NO. 4778

A MOTION establishing a Joint Citizens' Committee to assist in developing a Bond

Issue for Park and Recreation purposes

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for Seattle and King County, and designating members thereto.

WHEREAS, King County and other local governments are experiencing growth in population and increased public participation

WHEREAS, Seattle and other local governments presently have many older Park and Recreation Facilities which require rehabilitation, reconstruction, and other capital improvements to meet current user needs and to satisfy increasing levels of public usage, and

in sports and other recreation activities, and

WHEREAS, the conservation of energy resources is a focus of public policy, and recreation opportunities close to population centers are a major factor in energy conservation programs, and

WHEREAS, many recreation facilities are of regional significance and local governments within King County recognize the need for a Joint Park and Recreation Capital Improvement.

Program to yield the maximum benefit for all, and

WHEREAS, assistance and advice from citizens and elected officials are necessary to identify public park and recreation needs and to plan the most effective program to meet those needs,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY,
THE KING COUNTY EXECUTIVE CONCURRING:

1. That a Citizens' Committee be established, consisting of a Chairperson and thirty (30) citizens, and twelve(12) elected officials to assist King County, the City of Seattle, and suburban municipalities in identifying public recreation needs in planning a program of capital improvements, and in developing a

Bond Issue for Park and Recreation purposes to be submitted to the voters of King County at the General Election of 1980 or as soon thereafter as may be practical. The Committee shall consider and recommend, where appropriate, major regional projects as well as projects of principal benefit to local areas; and the Committee shall recommend a plan for the distribution of funds that recognizes the benefits and the costs of operating and maintaining both local and regional facilities. The package of proposals developed by the Committee shall be submitted for review to the Councils of the cities of King County prior to its submission to the County Council. The Committee shall be composed of:

- (a) Ten (10) citizens serving at the request of the City of Seattle,
- (b) Fourteen (14) citizens serving at the request of King County, with at least one citizen selected from each County Council District,
- (c) Six (6) citizens serving at the request of the Suburban Mayors' Association,
- (d) The Mayor and three Councilpersons of the City of Seattle,
- (e) The County Executive and four Councilpersons of King County,
- (f) Three (3) elected officials of suburban municipalities, selected by the Suburban Mayors' Association,
- (g) The Chairperson of the Committee shall be designated by the County Executive and the Mayor and the City of Seattle,
- (h) The County Executive and Mayor of Seattle may designate alternates to participate in Committee meetings in their absence. In the event that any citizen member requested to serve on the

Committee is unable to serve, the Committee may, by majority vote, select a replacement, provided that the original composition of the Committee as enumerated above is retained. BE IT FURTHER MOVED by the Council of King County that the King County Executive shall select the individuals serving at the request of King County from a list of fourteen nominees submitted by the King County Council. march PASSED this 17th day of 1980.
