A MOTION authorizing the County Executive to proceed with the Senior Housing Apartment Development Program.

WHEREAS, there exists a shortage of affordable apartment units in King County, and

WHEREAS, senior citizens on limited incomes are adversely affected by this shortage, and

WHEREAS, there exists a waiting list of 3½ years for available federally subsidized housing, and

WHEREAS, the King County Block Grant Consortium will receive only a limited number of senior federally assisted housing units over the next several years, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 4597 adopting the County's Community Development Block Grant projects and programs for 1980, allocated \$2 million of Block Grant funds to a Senior Housing Program with the proviso that no more than \$100,000 be spent in program development without further Council approval by motion, and

WHEREAS, the Senior Housing Program, making use of donated sites, Block Grant funds, and tax-exempt financing has been developed with the Housing Authority of King County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. The King County Executive is hereby authorized to proceed with the Senior Housing Program:

2. The King County Executive is also authorized to expend the Senior Housing Block Grant funds.

3. No later than July 1, 1980, the County Executive shall present to the Council for its approval recommended criteria for client eligibility.

4. The Council intends that the maximum rental rate be \$315 per month for a one-bedroom unit. At the earliest date it

1 appears the subsidies provided by this program are insufficient
2 to bring rents into this range, the Executive shall come to the
3 Council with recommendations for changes in the program.

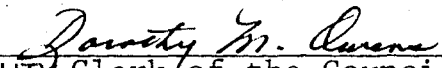
4 5. All sites utilized for this program must receive
