MOTION NO. 4815

A MOTION authorizing the County Executive to make a grant application for funds in the approximate amount of \$716,000 to support Bikeway Trail Projects, Grant File No. 012:2.

WHEREAS, the King County Council adopted the Urban Trails Plan in 1971 (Motion No. 625 on 9/27/71), which proposed that two-thirds of the trails should be constructed for walking or biking, about one-fifth for bicycles and the remaining one-seventh for other uses such as horseback riding; and

WHEREAS, the King County Council in 1976 adopted the King County General Bicycle Plan (Motion No. 2314, 2/17/76); and

WHEREAS, the Federal Bikeway Demonstration Program of 1975 (P.L. 93-643, Section 119, passed 1/4/75) provided six million dollars (\$6,000,000) nationwide of which King County received \$320,000 for construction of the Interurban Trail; and

WHEREAS, King County, in conjunction with Puget Sound Power and Light, Algona, Auburn, Kent, Pacific, Renton, and Tukwila were able to complete only 6.25 miles out of a total 16 miles of the Interurban Trail; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration administers a Bicycle Grant Program authorized by Section 141(c) of the Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1978; and

WHEREAS, four million dollars (\$4,000,000) nationwide has been appropriated to carry out Section 141(c) during fiscal year ending September 30, 1980 for State and Local bikeway-related projects; and

WHEREAS, King County has numerous nonmotorized bikeway and trail projects that have not been funded.

WHEREAS, the Council recognizes an obligation to provide the amount of \$239,000 as a 25% cash match in support of the projects.
