

MOTION NO. 5060

A MOTION concurring with the King County Executive's allocation of \$2,500 of the historic preservation block grant funds for Renton Fire Station and Black Diamond Depot. The historic preservation block grant funds were previously appropriated under the 1980 Housing and Community Development Block Grant Program.

WHEREAS, the King County Council has, through Ordinances 2991 & 4828, adopted the goal of preserving and selectively encouraging the restoration of buildings, sites and areas that depict the evolution of King County, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council has, through Ordinance 4760 authorized the expenditure of \$50,713 in 1980 Housing and Community Development Block Grant Funds for historic preservation projects, and

WHEREAS, a committee of citizens representing the disciplines of History, Architecture, Musology and Historic Preservation, appointed by the King County Executive, has reviewed project proposals based on published criteria and has identified the following projects as those of highest priority for County grant assistance, and

WHEREAS, the Association of King County Historical Organizations has, by motion, endorsed the following project recommendations, and

WHEREAS, the County Executive has reviewed and concurs with the recommendations;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County Council endorses the County Executive's allocation of historic preservation grant funds as recommended by the citizens committee and AKCHO as set forth in the following list:
