Existing rail facilities are currently

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managed by private carriers, it may be more cost-effective for government to support rail service under private management than to construct new public rail facilities or provide publicly-managed transit service on existing private lines. Previous studies of the feasibility of rail transit service in King County have not fully addressed the possible use of existing rail facilities under management of private carriers or AMTRAK. WHEREAS, from 1902 to 1928 the Interurban Line provided

passenger and freight rail service between Seattle and Tacoma via Renton, Kent and Auburn, and;

WHEREAS, Burlington Northern and the Union Pacific Railroads own right-of-way throughout King County, and;

WHEREAS, AMTRAK currently operates passenger and freight service on Burlington Northern right-of-way, and;

WHEREAS, passenger rail service utilizing existing rightof-way may be a more cost-effective alternative to the construction of an all new fixed guideway transportation system;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The Director of METRO Transit is requested to undertake a study of the technical feasibility, benefits, and costs of a commuter rail service in King County using existing rail facilities and operating under the management of AMTRAK or private rail carriers.
