MOTION NO. 5365

A MOTION setting forth the need for County Policies relating to County operated sewer service areas, requesting the Department of Public Works to prepare proposed policies to address that need, and adopting guidelines for the preparation of such policies.

WHEREAS, King County has established, operates and maintains sewerage systems under RCW 36.94, and

WHEREAS, King County has also assumed responsibilities for sewerage systems established under the Diking and Drainage statutes, and

WHEREAS, the sewerage systems operated by King County are located in different areas of the County, and

WHEREAS, the County has no formal policy on operating, maintaining and planning for new and existing sewerage systems, and

WHEREAS, it is desirable to establish policies on the role of King County in future expansion or operation of existing sewerage systems, and

WHEREAS, the County can expect to receive requests for sewerage service to address health hazards caused by septic tank failures in areas which cannot be readily served by sewer districts or cities, or to assume responsibility for marginally operable sewerage systems, and

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works has established a Sewer Utility Administration Section responsible for sewerage services provided by King County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. The County Executive is hereby requested to prepare proposed policies addressing the following:
- 1. The relationship and responsibility of the County to other agencies providing sewerage service, including special

districts, cities and towns, and Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle.

- 2. Criteria to be used when the County considers accepting, establishing, or otherwise acquiring, owning, or operating sewerage facilities. The preparation of these criteria should include, but not necessarily be limited to, appropriate areas and circumstances for the County to assume a sewerage service responsibility, economies of scale, cost effectiveness, and policies relating to the transfer or takeover of facilities to or from other sewerage service agencies.
- 3. Consistency with and the support and enhancement of, County land use plans and policies.
- 4. Relationship to the land use plans and policies of neighboring cities.
- 5. The feasibility of providing assistance to low and moderate income and elderly property owners, as defined by Community Block Grant policy, in bearing the cost of sewer improvements.
- B. The report submitting proposed policies for Council consideration should be prepared by the Department of Public Works, with the full participation of the Department of Planning and Community Development, Department of Budget and Program Development, the Prosecuting Attorney's Office and Council staff, and should be completed and transmitted to the Council by June 30, 1982.
