PROPOSED NO. 82-589

A MOTION supporting the recommendation of the June, 1982 sewer policy study, proposing that the Executive commence negotiations with appropriate agencies to transfer the operation and responsibility for current County operated systems.

WHEREAS, King County operates and maintains five sewerage systems located in different areas of the County, and

WHEREAS, some of King County's sewerage systems were established under the Diking and Drainage statutes and the remaining of sewerage systems were established under RCW 36.94, and

WHEREAS, the County Council requested through Motion

No. 5365 that the Department of Public Works prepare criteria to

be used when the County considers assuming or transferring

sewerage facilities to or from other sewer service agencies, and

WHEREAS, the King County Department of Public Works, with assistance from various Executive departments and King County Council staff, have recently completed a sewer policy study report entitled "An Analysis of Policy Options Regarding King County Operated Sewerage systems";

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The King County Council approves the recommendations of the June, 1982 "Analysis of Policy Options Regarding King County Operated Sewerage Systems," prepared pursuant to Motion No. 5365, and requests that the County Executive commence negotiations with appropriate agencies to determine the feasibility and desirability of transfering the operation and responsibility for all County operated systems.

These negotiations should determine:

- 1. The willingness of the appropriate agencies to assume operation of the Richmond Beach, Trend, Skyway, Olson, and Duwamish sewer systems; and
  - 2. Rates to be applied to current County users; and
  - 3. Any conditions of transfer.
- B. The Council further requests the Executive to conduct public meetings in each affected community to determine the level of support for any proposed system transfer.
- C. Should insufficient interest be expressed by alternative agencies, or should rates or conditions of transfer be unacceptable, the King County Council requests that the County Executive evaluate, as part of the 1984 Executive Budget preparation process, whether the current County Service Areas should be increased to achieve competitive County sewer rates in the long-term future.
