MOTION NO. 5726

A MOTION relating to Emergency Services, approving policy contained in the revised Emergency Services Operations Plan (ESOP) and stipulating specific provisos.

WHEREAS, "emergency services" is defined by general law as the preparation for and carrying out of all emergency functions, other than those for which the military forces are primarily responsible, to minimize and repair injury and damage, and to aid victims suffering from damage, resulting from natural, technological or war-caused disasters, and to provide for search and rescue operations for persons and property in distress; and

WHEREAS, King County, as a political subdivision of the state of Washington, is obliged to establish a local organization for emergency services in accordance with the state emergency services plan and program; and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Services Section, Field Operations Division, Department of Public Safety, is the local organization established for said purpose; and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Services Section is required to develop a plan for county-wide emergency services, implementing federal, state and county policy, as appropriate, relating to disaster recovery, and that said plan must be submitted to the state director of emergency services to secure recommendations thereon to ensure coordination with the state plan and program as specified in RCW 38.52.070; and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Services Section has developed a revision to the existing Emergency Services Operations Plan (ESOP) providing for an improved means for responding effectively to emergencies which may occur in King County by clarifying individual responsibilities and procedures; and

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WHEREAS, the ESOP, in order to implement emergency services policy, contains mission and purpose statements, which in the absence of an ordinance stating such policy, in essence represents policy determinations, and

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WHEREAS, the King County Council is empowered as the policy determining body of county government, and therefore responsible for approving comprehensive policy regarding county government operations in support of the provisions of the county home-rule charter, and

WHEREAS, Public Law 96-342, which amended the Federal Civil Defense Act of 1950, adds, as a matter of policy, the provision for enhancing civil defense through the development of crisis relocation plans in the event of nuclear war, and

WHEREAS, the assumptions behind said policy, that adequate warning of an anticipated nuclear attack could be provided, that a nuclear attack is survivable, and that a massive evacuation and relocation of affected population to less vulnerable locations is feasible, have been called into question by state and local officials throughout the nation; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency has indicated its intention to withhold certain federal funds supporting emergency services operations if crisis relocation plans in the event of nuclear war are not included in local ESOP's, but that the agency's authority to legally carry out such intentions has been called into question; and

WHEREAS, the revised ESOP as presently drafted, while containing crisis relocation plans to accommodate natural, technological and other-than-nuclear-war-caused disasters, does not contain specific crisis relocation plans for nuclear warfare, and

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WHEREAS, the revised ESOP, as presently drafted, provides in Appendix 2, Annex B, for the succession to the office of King County Executive where the elected county executive is unavailable or unable to carry out the emergency powers conferred upon the office of county executive by Ordinance 1058; and

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WHEREAS, RCW 42.14.070 states that the legislative authority of each political subdivision, shall adopt rules and regulations providing for the appointment of temporary interim successors to the elected and appointed offices of the political subdivision;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County Council approves, as a matter of policy, the contents of the 1983 revised Emergency Services Operations Plan (ESOP).

PROVIDED that:

A. Appendix 2, Annex B, Continuity of Government, Successor to King County Executive, is not approved and shall be withdrawn from the ESOP, until the County Council has approved by ordinance the policy for the appointment of temporary interim successors to the office of County Executive.

B. Crisis relocation plans specifically for nuclear warfare shall not be added to the ESOP without prior approval of the Council, but that relocation plans implemented in Annex G of the ESOP may be used and adopted as appropriate for situations not specifically covered in the annex.

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C. The ESOP shall be adequately tested and evaluated as soon as practical after final approval, by means of realistic simulated emergencies not involving actual movement of resources; and that following the test, a comprehensive critique of the test shall be conducted resulting in substantiated recommendations for changes to the organizations and procedures contained in the ESOP; but that if said findings indicate that basic emergency services policy should be modified, the recommendations shall be made in the form of a policy motion for Council approval.
