A MOTION calling for the formation of
the "King County Centennial '89 Advisory
Committee".

WHEREAS, on November 11, 1889, President Benjamin Harrison
signed the proclamation admitting Washington territory to the
union as the 42nd state, and,

WHEREAS, 1989 will mark the 100th anniversary of
Washington's statehood and,

WHEREAS, the legislature has created the Washington
Centennial Commission and charged the commission with the
development of a plan for the centennial celebration which
represents the contributions of all peoples and cultures to
Washington state history, and

WHEREAS, the Centennial Commission's report calls for the
formation of citizens advisory committees to assist in local
planning for centennial projects and programs;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The council endorses the formation of a King County
Centennial '89 Advisory Committee for the purpose of developing
a county-wide plan for the celebration of the Washington State
Centennial. The scope of the King County Centennial '89 Plan
shall include but not be limited to recommendations for capital
projects, events, and cooperative programming with federal,
state, and local agencies.


B. The county executive, in consultation with the
association of King County historical organizations, is
requested to recommend to the council a committee structure, a

1 charge to the committee, and list of nominees for confirmation
2 by the council. The membership of the Centennial '89 Committee
3 should reflect a variety of interests including historic
4 organizations, business, education, labor, chambers of commerce,
5 tourist and convention agencies, service clubs and other
6 interested groups.


7 C. The executive shall also recommend to the council
