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A MOTION initiating a Snoqualmie Community Plan, describing the scope of the Community Plan and Area Zoning, establishing the responsibilities of a community plan advisory committee and the King County planning division in developing the Snoqualmie Community Plan and approving the appointment of citizens to serve on the Snoqualmie Community Plan Advisory Committee.

WHEREAS, in March, 1983 the planning division published a Snoqualmie Community Profile which contains an inventory of existing conditions in the Snoqualmie planning area and applicable King County ordinances, and

WHEREAS, the community plan, when adopted by the county council, represents official policy guiding growth and development and establishes community project priorities for the Snoqualmie community planning area, and

WHEREAS, a community plan provides the link between general county-wide policies, plans and programs and specific implementation programs for a community, and

WHEREAS, a community plan is intended to be used by other governmental agencies when making decisions concerning land use and general community development, and

WHEREAS, the King County executive and the councilpersons from districts 3, 6, and 9 have recommended twenty members and five alternates to serve on the Snoqualmie Community Plan Advisory Committee, including one representative each from Duvall, Carnation, Snoqualmie and North Bend, and

WHEREAS, a chairperson for the Snoqualmie Community Plan Advisory Committee has been recommended by the director of the department of planning and community development and approved by the executive and King County councilpersons from district 3, 6, and 9;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The Snoqualmie Community Plan shall address the following local issues:

1. define a preferred land use pattern consistent with county-wide plans, policies, and regulations such as the zoning code;
2. determine what transportation routes, facilities, and services

1 are needed consistent with the land use pattern and recommend appropriate
2 local capital improvement projects;

3 3. identify high priority open space and park sites for acquisition
4 and recommend appropriate local park and recreation development projects;

5 4. define boundaries of local sewer and water service areas neces-
6 sary to implement plan policies. The advisory committee may make recommen-
7 dations outside the scope of the plan and these shall be presented separ-
8 ately as special recommendations for executive and council consideration of
9 amendments to county policies or controls.

10 B. The Snoqualmie Area Zoning shall include:

11 1. depictions of the area zoning classifications necessary to imple-
12 ment the recommended land use policies; and

13 2. explanations for the applied zoning classifications.

14 C. The Snoqualmie Community Plan shall be consistent with existing
15 county plans, policies, and regulations such as the comprehensive land use
16 plan, zoning code, and sewerage plan in effect at the time the community
17 plan is adopted.

18 D. The Snoqualmie Community Plan shall consider adopted plans of adja-
19 cent incorporated jurisdictions and special purpose districts.

20 BE IT FURTHER MOVED,

21 There is established a twenty-member Snoqualmie Community Plan Advisory
22 Committee, a nonresident chairperson, and five alternates, as follows:

23 A. The attached list of members and alternates for the Snoqualmie Plan
24 Advisory Committee is approved as presented.

25 B. In the event a member is unable to complete his or her term, the
26 appointed alternates shall serve in order named.

27 C. There shall be five alternates. The executive and council shall
28 select additional alternates if needed due to committee resignations.
29 Duvall, Carnation, Snoqualmie and North Bend shall select replacements when
30 needed due to city representative resignations.

31 D. All committee members and alternates shall be subject to the dis-
32 closure provisions of K.C.C. 3.04.050

1 BE IT FURTHER MOVED,

2 A. The King County planning and community development staff is re-
3 sponsible for preparing the Snoqualmie Community Plan documents. Community
4 planning staff will lead the community planning effort and direct the pro-
5 gress of the community plan advisory committee in their discussions and
6 review of staff work.

7 B. The committee shall review work of the planning staff, consider
8 comments from the general community and technical experts, and shall make
9 recommendations to staff as appropriate. Regular advisory committee meet-
10 ings shall end after the committee reviews the working draft plan. Com-
11 mittee members are encouraged to individually participate in the public
12 review process until council adoption.

13 C. King County intends that committee discussion of issues will be
14 tied to the attached work schedule. If committee consensus is not reached,
15 areas of disagreement will be identified, and the next phase of the process
16 will begin.

17 D. Throughout the Snoqualmie community planning process, the plan
18 advisory committee shall consider the local community's role and responsi-
19 bilities within the context of the broader, county-wide community. The
20 committee's responsibilities include consideration of the following issues:

- 21 1. examining the impacts of local decisions on county-wide needs and
22 opportunities;
- 23 2. providing the community's fair share of anticipated growth; and
- 24 3. providing housing and economic opportunities for all income
25 levels.

26 E. Since one of the purposes of the plan advisory committee is to
27 provide a vehicle for bringing together the diverse interests within the
28 Snoqualmie planning area, the committee should seek, encourage and facili-
29 tate broad community involvement.

30 F. Throughout the planning process, planning staff shall also be re-
31 sponsible for coordinating, considering and evaluating the views of the
32 general public, technical experts, and the advisory committee.

1 G. The chairperson is responsible for running the plan advisory com-
2 mittee meetings, including setting agendas with staff, keeping on schedule,
3 and making sure all viewpoints of Committee members are expressed.
