MOTION NO. 6186

A MOTION condemning racial apartheid in South Africa and outlining certain actions to be undertaken by King County.

WHEREAS, the Republic of South Africa policy of racial apartheid is contrary to stated policies of King County as represented by Section 840 of the King County Charter, which prohibits the county from entering into any contract with any organization which discriminates on the basis of race or color, and

WHEREAS, many King County citizens, including the hundreds who demonstrated in front of the South African government's consulate are opposed to the racial discrimination policy of the South African government, and

WHEREAS, several U.S. government representatives have spoken against South Africa, including the President of the United States, who has called for the end of apartheid in South Africa, and United States cities have policies directed at withdrawing public funds from institutions which do business in South Africa;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The King County council condemns racial apartheid in South Africa and requests all King County departments to refrain from participating in informational or cultural exchanges with any corresponding entity at any level of South African government until racial apartheid is abolished in South Africa.

B. The King County council calls on the people of King County to refrain from purchasing Krugerrand gold which is issued by the South African government, until racial apartheid in South Africa is abolished.

C. The King County council petitions the Washington State Congressional delegation to work for laws prohibiting

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the United States government from engaging in cultural, informational, economic, political, diplomatic, and technical exchange with the South African government at all levels until racial apartheid in South Africa is abolished.

D. The King County council requests the King County executive to prepare a report detailing the extent to which King County funds are directly processed by financial institutions which maintain a direct financial relationship with South Africa.

E. The King County council requests the King County executive to work cooperatively to draft investment policies prohibiting King County from engaging in direct financial relationships with commercial banks, thrift institutions and brokerage firms dealing directly with the government of South Africa.

F. The King County council additionally finds the presence of the honorary South African consulate in King County an embarrassment and a public nuisance and therefore calls on the South African consulate to close.
