MOTION NO. 3291

A MOTION concurring with the King County Executive's allocation of \$40,610 of historic preservation Block Grant funds for restoration of three historic landmarks. The historic preservation Block Grant funds were appropriated under 1980, 1982, and 1985 Housing and Community Development Block Grant Programs.

WHEREAS, the King County council has, through Ordinance 2991, and Ordinance 4828, adopted the goal of preserving and selectively encouraging the restoration of buildings, sites and areas that depict the evolution of King County, and

WHEREAS, the King County council, has through Ordinances 6762, 5928 and 7202 authorized the expenditure of 1980, 1982, and 1985 Housing and Community Block Grant Funds for historic preservation projects, and

WHEREAS, the King County landmarks commission has reviewed project proposals based on published criteria and has named the following three historic landmarks as the highest priorities for King County grant assistance, and

WHEREAS, the county executive has reviewed and concurs with the above recommendations;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1 The King County council endorses the county executive's allocation
2 of historic preservation grant funds for the following restoration projects
3 as recommended by the King County landmarks commission.
