MOTION NO.

A MOTION authorizing the King County executive to submit an application for funding to the State of Washington Office of Financial Management to offset the cost impact of enhanced enforcement of laws prohibiting driving while intoxicated.

WHEREAS, the State of Washington, by the adoption of Substitute Senate Bill 3656, Section 121(4), allocated \$1 million for grants to cities and counties to offset the costs of prosecution and adjudication of DWI and physical control offenses, during the period of 1 July 1985 and 28 February 1986, and

WHEREAS, such grants are limited to those cities and counties which received similar grants for the period of 15 September 1984 and 30 June 1985, and

WHEREAS, King County received such a grant for the use of the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney and for the King County District Courts; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney requests renewal of grant funding for two deputy prosecuting attorneys and King County District Courts request renewal of grant funding for 6.5 probation counselors and 2 full-time clerical support staff, and

WHEREAS, the cost impact of DWI and physical control prosecution and adjudication can be mitigated by accepting funding from the State of Washington;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. The King County executive is hereby authorized to submit a grant renewal application on behalf of the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney and King County District Courts to the State of Washington, Office of Financial Management, for state funds to offset the cost impact of enhanced enforcement of DWI and physical control prosecution and adjudication.
 - B. Continuation of any King County staff positions funded

in 1985-1986 as a result of this grant application will be contingent upon the continued availability of state funds.

C. Prior to acceptance of any grant of state funds and subsequent appropriation of those funds, the King County budget office will review the requests made by the district courts and the prosecuting attorney and, on the basis of this review, the county executive will recommend whether or not the grant should be accepted.
