

MOTION NO. <u>6457</u>

A MOTION declaring the existence of an emergency due to heavy rainfall, mudslides, and flooding conditions in King County, requiring immediate repair of county roads and other facilities, waiving the requirements for competitive bidding or formal solicitation and Minority and Women's Business Enterprises requirements for such repairs and ratifying and confirming the Local Proclamation of Emergency issued by the King County Executive on January 21, 1986.

WHEREAS, weather conditions consisting of heavy rainfall creating extensive flooding in King County caused extensive damage to county facilities; and

WHEREAS, persons and property have been and will be damaged unless further efforts are taken to reduce the threat to life and property; and

WHEREAS, such repair work to county roads and other facilities must begin immediately in order to minimize the risk of personal injury and property damage; and

WHEREAS, the ordinary requirements for formal competitive bidding of the construction contracts pursuant to RCW Ch. 36.32 and formal solicitation requirements for professional/technical service consultant contracts and the purchase of tangible personal property pursuant to KCC Ch. 4.16 and compliance with Minority and Women's Business Enterprises requirements pursuant to KCC Ch. 4.18 for such repairs must be waived in order to prevent delay in beginning such repair work; and

on January 21, 1986, pursuant to RCW Ch. 36.40.180, RCW Ch. 38.52 and KCC Ch. 12.52, and attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, and the council acknowledges receipt of the local proclamation of emergency;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The King County Council declares that an emergency exists in King County whereby the public interest would suffer material injury if necessary repair work is delayed.

- B. The ordinary requirements for competitive bidding of construction contracts pursuant to RCW Ch. 36.32 and formal solicitation requirements for professional/technical service consultant contracts and the purchase of tangible personal property pursuant to KCC 4.16 and compliance with Minority and Women's Business Enterprises requirements pursuant to KCC Ch. 4.18 for such repair work by the department of public works, the department of planning and community development, parks division, the department of adult detention and the department of youth services are hereby waived.
- C. Provided that the Executive shall negotiate with potential contractors in an attempt to meet Minority and Women's Business Enterprises utilization requirements for construction contracts and shall report back to the Council after contract award and after contract completion.
- D. The King County council hereby ratifies and confirms the local proclamation of emergency pursuant to KCC 12.52.030(B)(12).

A MOTION authorizing the county executive to make a grant application for funds in the approximate amount of \$150,000 to support juvenile diagnostic services, Grant File No. 601.

WHEREAS, the Department of Social and Health Services is empowered to make grants to support services to juvenile offenders, and

WHEREAS, the juvenile diagnostic services project will assist the county in meeting the needs of the community to hold juvenile offenders accountable for their actions, and

WHEREAS, the council of King County finds that provision of such services is in the public interest;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the council of King County:

- The King County executive is hereby authorized to make application for funds in the approximate amount of \$150,000 to the Department of Social and Health Services, Division of Juvenile Rehabilitation for the juvenile diagnostic services project on behalf of King County;
- The King County executive is hereby authorized to file and execute such application and enter into and execute such contracts as are required by the grantor;
- The King County executive is also authorized to enter into and execute such subcontracts as are necessary for the implementation of the project;
- The Department of Social and Health Services is hereby assured full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act.
