2 A MOTION related to the King County Park System
3 authorizing the Executive to accept the deed to a
4 one hundred twenty acre parcel of County Trust
Lands administered by the Department of Natural
Resources.

5 WHEREAS, on June 16, 1932 King County received title to a one hundred
6 twenty acre parcel of property on the East Lake Sammamish Plateau via tax
7 foreclosure proceedings, and

8 WHEREAS, on April 7, 1983 King County transferred title to this property
9 to the State Forestry Board, currently the State Department of Natural Resources
10 (DNR), and

11 WHEREAS, the timber on this property is, in the opinion of the DNR, of
12 little value given the Red Alder, Cottonwood, second growth Douglas Fir which
13 are found on this site, and

14 WHEREAS, the Cedar River Bowman, a nonprofit recreational organization
15 with membership open to the general public has sponsored archery education,
16 tournaments, archery clinics and practices on approximately sixty-five acres of
17 this site since 1960, and

18 WHEREAS, there is an increasing need for public parks on the East Lake
19 Sammamish Plateau based on residential, commercial and business development
20 in the area, and

21 WHEREAS, RCW 76.12.072 provides for the transfer of state forest land
22 from DNR to any county when the lands are needed for public park purposes;

23 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

24 A. Pursuant to the provisions of RCW 76.12.072, the King County executive
25 is hereby authorized to execute the transfer of the following property from the
26 DNR to the King County parks and recreation division for mutual benefits:

27 NW 1/4, NE 1/4, and SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 12,
28 T24N, R6E, KING COUNTY, STATE OF WASHINGTON.

1. Provided that, this land will only be used by King County for public park purposes: Use of this land for public purposes is consistent with the East Lake Sammamish Park Community Plan and the Comprehensive Plan.

2. The DNR will not authorize or conduct any timber harvesting on this site without prior written approval from the manager of the King County parks and recreation division.

B. The executive is authorized to terminate this transfer should the DNR impose any conditions, in the judgment of King County, which are not compatible with a public park located in a rapidly growing area of King County. If termination of the DNR transfer is proposed, the executive will first report to the council for its consideration and possible action prior to the proposed final transmittal to the DNR.
