MOTION NO. 6570

A MOTION establishing the County's intent to form a Park and Recreation Service Area to be known as the Issaquah Park and Recreation Service Area and establishing a public hearing on the feasibility study of the proposed Issaquah Park and Recreation Service Area.

WHEREAS, the City of Issaquah has requested by letter to the King County Council that the council form a park and recreation service area pursuant to RCW 36.68.400 for the purpose of financing construction of a community center within the city of Issaquah to serve residents of the city of Issaquah and of unincorporated King County in an area of approximately 85 square miles surrounding the city of Issaquah, and

WHEREAS, the council, by Motion 6502, requested the executive to prepare a feasibility study of the Issaquah proposal, and

WHEREAS, RCW 36.68.440 requires the council to establish findings on the proposal, based on a public hearing about the feasibility study, prior to submitting the proposal to the voters;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

A. It is the council's intent to explore the possibility of forming a park and recreation service area, to be known as the Issaquah Park and Recreation Service Area, within the following boundaries, subject to approval by the voters within said area:

Beginning at the point of intersection of the north line of Sec. 6, Twp. 24N, R6E and the shore of Lake Sammamish, thence east to the NE corner of Sec. 1, Twp. 24N, R6E; thence south to the NW corner of Sec. 19, Twp, 24N, R7E; thence east to the NE corner of said Sec. 19; thence south to the SE corner of said Sec. 19, Twp. 24N, R7E; thence east to the SW corner of the SE 1/4 of Sec. 20, Twp. 24N, R7E; thence north to the NW corner of the SE 1/4 of said Sec. 20; thence east to the NE corner of the SE 1/4 of said Sec. 20; thence south to the SE corner of the SE

1 1/4 of said Sec. 20 Twp. 24N, R7E; thence east to the NE corner
 2 of Sec. 28, Twp. 24N, R7E; thence south to the NW corner of the
 3 SW 1/4 of Sec. 34, Twp. 24N, R7E; thence east to the NE corner of
 4 the SW 1/4 of said Sec. 34; thence south to the SE corner of the
 5 SW 1/4 of said Sec. 34, Twp. 24N, R7E; thence east to the NE
 6 corner of Sec. 3, Twp. 25N, R7E; thence south to the NW corner of
 7 the SW 1/4 of Sec. 2, Twp. 23N, R7E; thence east to the NE corner
 8 of the SW 1/4 of said Sec. 2; thence south to the SE corner of
 9 the SW 1/4 of said Sec. 2; thence east to the NE corner of Sec.
 10 12, Twp. 23N, R7E; thence south to the SE corner of said Sec. 12,
 11 Twp. 23N, R7E; thence west to the NE corner of Sec. 16, Twp. 23N,
 12 R7E; thence south to the SE corner of Sec. 21, Twp. 23N, R7E;
 13 thence west to the NE corner of Sec. 30, Twp. 23N, R7E; thence
 14 south to the SE corner of said Sec. 30; thence west to the SW
 15 corner of said Sec. 30, thence south to the SE corner of Sec. 36,
 16 Twp. 23N, R6E; thence west to the SW corner of said Sec. 36;
 17 thence north to the NW corner of said Sec. 36; thence west to the
 18 NE corner of Sec. 33, Twp. 23N, R6E; thence south to the SE
 19 corner of the NE 1/4 of said Sec. 33; thence west to the SW
 20 corner of the NW 1/4 of said Sec. 33; thence north along the west
 21 line of Sections 33, 28, 21, and 16, Twp. 23N, R6E, W. M. to the
 22 center line of SE May Valley Rd. (SE 136th St.), thence
 23 northwesterly along said center line to the west line of Sec. 7,
 24 said Twp. 23N, R6E, W.M.; thence north along said Sec. 7 and 6,
 25 Twp. 23N, R6E, W.M. and continuing north along the west lines of
 26 Sec. 31, 30, 19, and 18, Twp. 24N, R6E, W.M. to the center of
 27 state highway I 90, thence southeasterly along said I 90 center
 28 line 1468 ft. more or less, to the easterly line of Timberlake
 29 Park projected southerly, thence northeasterly and northerly
 30 along the east marginal said Timberlake Park, to the north line
 31 of Sec. 6, Twp. 24N, R6E, W. M.; thence east to the point of
 32 beginning. All situate in King County, Washington.

18 This park and recreation service area shall be for the purpose of
 19 financing park facilities, improvements and services to serve the
 20 residents within its boundaries.

21 B. It is the council's further intent to explore the
 22 possibility of submitting to the voters of the proposed Issaquah
 23 Park and Recreation Service Area a general obligation bond
 24 proposal to finance construction of a community center in the
 25 city of Issaquah, for use by all residents of the area. The
 26 estimated cost of the proposal is \$6.864 million.

27 C. The feasibility study requested of the executive in
 28 Motion 6502 should be filed with the clerk of the council no
 29 later than June 23, 1986.

1 D. A public hearing on the feasibility study will be held on
2 Monday, June 30, 1986. Notice of the hearing shall be published
3 at least twice, no less than five days in advance of the hearing,
4 in a legal newspaper serving the county.
