MOTION NO.

A MOTION authorizing the county executive to make a grant application for funds in the approximate amount of \$225,000 to support a program to survey myocardial infarctions in King County, grant File No. 612.

WHEREAS, the Laerdal Foundation for Acute Medicine is authorized to make grants of funds to support programs relating to the practice of emergency medicine and extending medical knowledge in this field, and

WHEREAS, the presently available knowledge regarding myocardial infarctions in King County, and elsewhere, is limited and would be materially improved through the collection of additional data, and

WHEREAS, a survey of myocardial infarctions in King County would develop a base of data from which improvements can be expected to be introduced in the recognition and treatment of myocardial infarctions by emergency medical services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. The King County executive is hereby authorized to make application for funds in the approximate amount of \$225,000 to the Laerdal Foundation for Acute Medicine for a program to survey myocardial infarctions in King County on behalf of King County;
- B. The King County executive is hereby authorized to file and execute such contracts as are required by the grantor;

- C. The King County executive is also authorized to enter into and execute such subcontracts as are necessary for the implementation of the project;
- D. The Laerdal Foundation is hereby assured full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED,

The council recognizes that Harborview Medical Center and the University of Washington, in conjunction with the King County Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Division, is working on a grant proposal to submit to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). The DHHS proposal would extend the myocardial infarction survey into the City of Seattle and would supplant a portion of the Laerdal grant funding. Furthermore, it is anticipated that the University of Washington would subcontract with the King County EMS Division to spend a portion of the DHHS funds.

Therefore, the executive, when a supplemental appropriation is transmitted to the council for the purpose of executing a subcontract with the University of Washington, is requested to explain how the freed-up Laerdal funds will be spent.
