MOTION NO. 6603

A MOTION relating to the King County park system authorizing King County parks and recreation division to negotiate an agreement with METRO for sewer service, and certifying that a side sewer connection for the Sammamish River Trail Restrooms is consistent with King County land use plans and policies.

WHEREAS, the county council has authorized the sale of bonds and appropriated \$430,000 for improvements including the construction of restroom/concession stands on the Sammamish River Trail, and

WHEREAS, the Sammamish River Trail site does not meet the requirements for on-site wastewater disposal methods based on public health standards and consistent with county land use policies, and

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle (METRO) owns and maintains an interceptor line which traverses King County park property parallel to the Sammamish River Trail, and

WHEREAS, METRO will allow King County to hook into the interceptor via a side sewer connection, and

WHEREAS, Article 3.1, King County Sewerage General Plan provides for allowing individual side sewer connections to a sewage system outside the local service area provided the side sewer connection is owned by the owner of the building and not the sewer utility, and

WHEREAS, the connection will be made to a building owned by the county and not the sewer utility, and

WHEREAS, METRO, pursuant to METRO Resolution No. 2933, requires for every connection to a METRO interceptor, a certification from the legislative body of the jurisdiction with authority over land use, that the connection is consistent with that jurisdiction's land use plans and policies;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. King County parks and recreation division is authorized to negotiate with METRO for sewer service for the Sammamish Trail Restrooms.
- B. The county council certifies that the side sewer connection to METRO's interceptor line for the Sammamish Trail Restrooms is consistent with King County's land use plans and policies.
