A MOTION agreeing to common terminology for use in interlocal planning agreements developed to implement the King County Comprehensive Plan.

WHEREAS, King County and the municipalities within the county are expecting to accommodate 350,000 new residents by the year 2000, and

WHEREAS, a major portion of this anticipated growth will occur in the suburban cities or in the county on the perimeter of the cities due to the proximity of shopping and employment opportunities, the availability of vacant developable land, and access to necessary public services and utilities, and

WHEREAS, it is difficult to efficiently accommodate growth in these suburban areas given the multiplicity of jurisdictions which may be affected, and

WHEREAS, there is an urgent need for all the jurisdictions in King County to cooperatively plan for and minimize the impacts of growth in this county, and

WHEREAS, the county has adopted policies in the King County Comprehensive Plan which support cooperation between the county and the cities in the county in their mutual attempts to efficiently accommodate new growth and development, and

WHEREAS, the King County Comprehensive Plan recommends that interlocal planning agreements be used to implement the aforementioned policy, and

WHEREAS, the King County planning division and Suburban Planning
Directors, providing technical support for the elected officials in the
Suburban Cities Association, have been working to develop a model interlocal
agreement and a process for enacting such agreements, and

WHEREAS, as a part of this technical support effort King County planning division and Suburban Planning Directors have determined that some standardized terminology would be helpful in referring to unincorporated territory on the periphery of cities, and

B. The aforementioned standardized terminology is intended for use in interlocal planning agreements implementing King County Comprehensive Plan policies relative to land use planning and intergovernmental coordination and will not be required in other interlocal agreements.
