MOTION NO. 6789

A MOTION declaring the existence of an emergency in the King County Jail requiring the immediate addition of sixty-two dormitory bunks to the facility and waiving the requirements of competitive bidding for the work.

WHEREAS, the Washington State Corrections Standards Board has authorized the addition of sixty-two dormitory bunks to the King County Jail, and

WHEREAS, the addition of these bunks will help alleviate crowded conditions in the King County Jail, and

WHEREAS, the ordinary requirements for formal competitive bidding of the construction contracts necessary for this work must be waived to prevent delay in beginning construction of the bunks, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 4551 and K.C.C. 4.16.050 permit waiver of the requirements of public bidding by motion of the King County Council upon declaration of an emergency and where the public interest or property of King County would suffer material injury or damage by delay;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The King County Council declares that an emergency exists in the King County Jail whereby the public interest will suffer material injury and damage if necessary work to add sixty-two new dormitory bunks to the facility is delayed.

B. The ordinary requirements for formal competitive bidding of the construction contracts necessary for such work are hereby waived.
