A MOTION concurring with the King County Executive's allocation of \$30,000 in Community Development Block Grant Funds for four historic preservation projects. The historic preservation CDBG funds were appropriated under 1987 Housing and Community Development Block Grant Programs.

WHEREAS, the King County council has, through Ordinance 2991, and Ordinance 4828, adopted the goal of preserving and selectively encouraging the restoration of buildings, sites and areas that depict the evolution of King County, and

WHEREAS, the King County council, has through Ordinance 7649 authorized the expenditure of 1987 Housing and Community Block Grant funds for historic preservation projects, and

WHEREAS, the King County landmarks commission has reviewed project proposals based on published criteria and has named four preservation projects as the highest priorities for King County grant assistance, and

WHEREAS, the county executive has reviewed and concurs with the recommendations;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County council endorses the county executive's allocation of historic preservation grant funds for the following preservation projects as recommended by the King County landmarks commission:

Crawford Store, Richmond Beach	\$ 5,000
Hjertoos Farm, Carnation	15,000
Dougherty Farm, Duvall	4,000
Harshman House, Fall City	6,000
