MOTION NO. 6868

A MOTION approving a revision to the scope of work and the schedule for CIP Project No. 002301, Police Shooting Ranges.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 7341 adopted in 1985 approved a scope of work and budget for the construction of three police shooting ranges, designated CIP Project No. 002301, to be built at Maple Valley, Kenmore, and Burien and to be completed by December of 1987, and

WHEREAS, Motion 6560 adopted in May of 1986 reaffirmed the intention of the council that the adopted budget of \$800,000 for the three shooting ranges was the maximum amount to be expended on these projects, and

WHEREAS, the department of public safety and the facilities management division now state that the \$800,000 budget is sufficient only to build two police shooting ranges, and

WHEREAS, a revision to the original scope of work and budget as required by K.C.C. 4.04.030 is attached and found to be satisfactory by the council;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The revised scope of work, schedule, and project budget for CIP Project No. 002301, attached, is approved for the Kenmore shooting range. The Council also intends that the joint King County/Port of Seattle shooting range be located in Burien and that a scope of work, schedule, and budget for this project be submitted to the Council for approval no later than June 30, 1987.

1 If the Council is not satisfied with a "good faith" agreement  
2 between King County and the Port of Seattle, the remaining funds  
3 will be used to build a shooting range at the Maple Valley  
4 Precinct.

5 It remains the intention of the council that the adopted  
6 budget of \$800,000 shall be the maximum amount to be spent by  
7 King County for the construction of the two police shooting  
8 ranges.

9 The county executive is requested to prepare a proposal to be  
10 funded by limited general obligation bonds for the construction  
11 of a police precinct and shooting range to be located north of  
12 Interstate 90 and east of Lake Washington.

MOTION NO. 6869

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A MOTION authorizing the King County executive to submit an application for funding to the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for the Rental Rehabilitation Program and enter into interlocal agreements and/or memorandums of understanding necessary to implement the program.

WHEREAS, the federal government through the adoption and administration of the Housing and Urban-Rural Recovery Act of 1983 will make \$328,000 of 1987 Rental Rehabilitation Program funds available to King County, and

WHEREAS, the federal government through the regulations for the Rental Rehabilitation Program requires King County to submit an application for the funds to the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by review of data from the 1980 U. S. Census, the King County 1981 Housing Condition Survey, and available data on rents in King County that neighborhoods and properties exist in King County that meet the eligibility requirements of the federal regulations for the Rental Rehabilitation Program, and

WHEREAS, the Rental Rehabilitation Program provides section 8 existing housing certificates and vouchers for eligible low-income tenants of properties rehabilitated through the program to assist them with monthly housing costs, and

WHEREAS, section 8 existing housing certificates and vouchers are administered through local housing authorities, and

WHEREAS, the federal government through the regulations for the Rental Rehabilitation Program requires a memorandum of understanding between local governments and housing authorities in order to participate in the program and receive the rehabilitation funds and section 8 certificates and vouchers;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The King County executive is hereby authorized to submit 1987 program application to the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for the Rental Rehabilitation Program.

1           B. The King County executive is also authorized to enter into inter-  
 2 local agreements with Community Development Block Grant Consortium cities if  
 3 necessary to implement the program and to enter into the required memoran-  
 4 dum(s) of understanding with the Housing Authority, County of King, and Renton  
 5 Housing Authority to administer the section 8 existing housing certificates  
 6 and vouchers provided in the Rental Rehabilitation Program.
