MOTION NO. 7022

A MOTION approving private development and operation of an Olympic size aquatic facility by the Pacific Northwest Aquatics Foundation, at West Campus in Federal Way.

WHEREAS, the Puget Sound region wishes to promote the development of swimmers and divers who are nationally and internationally competitive, and

WHEREAS, competition events are necessary to promote this $\ensuremath{\mathsf{goal}}$, and

WHEREAS, such events should be staged in facilities which meet international ("Olympic") standards for both swimming and diving, and

WHEREAS, existing facilities are insufficient as to size, location, spectator room or other factors, or are not available to the general public and the many swimming teams that exist in the Puget Sound region, and

WHEREAS, the Pacific Northwest Aquatics Foundation is pursuing and expects to be able to fund and construct an appropriate facility in Federal Way which it proposes to locate on open space located in the Panther Lake open space area of Quadrant's West Campus Development, and

WHEREAS, the use of said open space is subject to certain covenants, conditions and restrictions recorded under King County Records #7611120551, and

WHEREAS, the proposed use of said open space for an aquatic facility is consistent with purposes of the open space, and with the recorded covenants, conditions, and restrictions;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

King County finds that such a facility located on the
above-described site would be a suitable use of this property,
if substantial public access and use are guaranteed.

PROVIDED THAT:

- 1. The property owner obtains such land use and building permits as are required by King County regulations.
- 2. The property owner obtains approval of a site development plan as stipulated in section 2.1 of the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions, dated November 11, 1976 and filed under King County Recording No. 7611120551.
- 3, This motion shall not be considered as a commitment for approval or prejudgment by King County of any application for required permits or site development plans.
