A MOTION related to King County employee child day care; finding and determining its obligation as an employer to county employees and requesting a proposal from the County Executive.

WHEREAS, King County employs approximately 5,300 persons, and

WHEREAS, many county employees are parents of young children,

and

WHEREAS, assessing, arranging and managing child care continues to be a significant source of anxiety for County employees, and

WHEREAS, King County is a progressive employer which historically has provided leadership in addressing a broad range of issues concerning the welfare of both its employees and its citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The council finds and determines that as an employer the county has an obligation to find an appropriate way to support day care for the children of county employees.

B. The council requests the county executive to submit a proposal for council consideration by June 30, 1988 addressing how child care can best be provided to county employees as a benefit in a cost-effective manner including, but not limited to, consideration of appropriate day care referral services, contracted day care services, and utilization of federal child care reimbursement accounts.
