A MOTION establishing the 1988 State Legislative Program for King County.

WHEREAS, the King County executive and the King County council want to bring their common positions on issues facing the 1988 Washington State Legislature to the attention of Washington State Legislators, other elected officials, and King County residents, and

WHEREAS, the King County executive and the King County council want to work cooperatively with other local governments and other organizations, such as the Suburban Cities Association, the Washington State Association of Counties, the Washington Association of County Officials, and the Association of Washington Cities, and

WHEREAS, the King County executive and the King County council will continue to review legislative developments for possible revision of King County's 1988 State Legislative Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the council of King County, the King County executive concurring:

The specific objectives set forth in this Motion and Attachment A represent King County's State Legislative Program for 1988. The ten objectives set forth below are King County's highest priorities for passage during the 1988 Session of the Washington State Legislature:

Seek authority for counties to levy a local option liquor tax to finance the construction of housing and treatment centers for alcoholics.

- Support efforts of the Association of Counties to secure 0 additional optional taxing authority for counties.
- Support an increase in the gasoline tax which provides increased funds to address needed state and local transportation improvements.
- Seek legislation which implements those provisions of Initiative 62 which prohibits either new state mandates or expansion of existing local government responsibilities unless funds are made available to implement such responsibilities.
- Support legislation which affirms existing law and 0 practice regarding property tax collection and disbursement.
- Seek legislation which affirms that the conservation 0 futures levy is outside statutory limitations on regular property tax levies.
- Seek amendments to the Sentencing Reform Act which authorizes electronically monitored home detention for certain non-violent offenses.
- Support legislation which enhances waste reduction and 0 recycling as part of a comprehensive system of solid waste disposal.
- Support current or enhanced funding levels for mental 0 health, developmentally disabled, alcoholism, housing and public health programs.
