A MOTION providing Policy Direction to the Puget Sound Council of Governments with regard to the proposed Regional Airport System Plan.

WHEREAS, the Puget Sound Council of Governments has prepared a draft Regional Airport System Plan, and

WHEREAS, the RASP calls for consideration of a number of alternatives for providing additional capacity for air carriers in the Puget Sound region, and

WHEREAS, one of the alternatives which the RASP proposes to consider is the addition of a third runway at SEA-TAC International Airport, and

WHEREAS, a third runway at SEA-TAC would require the acquisition of an estimated 1700 acres of land that could include properties extending from the existing airport south to South 216th Street, west to First Avenue South and north to South 128th Street, an area that includes 9 public school facilities, over 5,000 homes and is the residence or workplace of more than 20,000 people, and

WHEREAS, expansion of SEA-TAC International Airport is not compatable with land use policies in the Highline and Sea-Tac Community Plans, and

WHEREAS, the "third runway alternative" is estimated to be the most costly alternative at 2.75 Billion dollars, will have severe community, physical and environmental impacts, and is least likely to serve adequately the growing north and south Puget Sound areas, and

WHEREAS, continuing growth in demands for ground transportation through the region will severely stress access to SEA-TAC airport, and

WHEREAS, the region's public transportation system (whether rail or bus) can be designed and constructed to serve satellite airport locations, to the benefit of the region as a whole and the users of air carriers, and

WHEREAS, the RASP planning process and the discussion of a third runway has disrupted the lives of SEA-TAC and Highline residents, threatened to depress property values and has created uncertainty as to the future of those communities,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. King County opposes any further consideration of the "third runway alternative" by the Puget Sound Council of Governments in its regional airport planning process and requests that this alternative be deleted from the final Regional Airport Systems Plan report.
- B. Any consideration of major capital improvements or increased capacity at SEA-TAC must not be based on a "worst case" analysis, but must instead be planned with severe constraints that limit airport size to existing physical boundaries and without disruption to the people and property of the surrounding communities, and
- C. Serious consideration, as an alternative, must be given to co-ordination of operations and system management improvements at SEA-TAC and Boeing Field / King County International which could eliminate the need to provide additional runway capacity.
