MOTION NO. _____

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A MOTION approving the appointment of persons to serve on the Green-Duwamish Early Action Watershed Management Committee.

WHEREAS, King County has been designated lead agency for the Green-Duwamish Early Action Watershed Project, and

WHEREAS, the lead agency is to organize a Watershed Management Committee consisting of representatives from all general purpose governments with jurisdiction and all tribes with tribal territory or usual and accustomed fishing rights within the watershed, and

WHEREAS, an Initial Watershed Management Committee composed of representatives of the King County council, the King County executive, the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe and the mayors of the eight cities having jurisdiction in the watershed of the Green-Duwamish Rivers met in Kent, Washington on January 19, 1988, and

WHEREAS, the Initial Watershed Management Committee has recommended a Watershed Management Committee which includes a representative of the King County council, the cities upstream of Highway 18, the cities downstream of Highway 18, the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe, the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle (Metro), and six parties directly affected by the adoption and implementation of the Action Plan, and

WHEREAS, eleven knowledgeable and qualified persons have shown an interest in becoming members of the Green-Duwamish Early Action Watershed Management Committee;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. There is established an eleven-member Green-Duwamish Early Action Watershed Management Committee composed of the individuals listed in Appendix A.


B. It is expected that no new members will be added to the committee during the planning process. In the event a member is unable to complete his or her term, the parks, planning and resources department may recommend to the King County executive and councilperson from district 8 a replacement if necessary to complete the committee's work.

1 C. There shall be one member each from the cities upstream and downstream of
2 Highway 18 and from the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe. The mayors of the affected cities or
3 the Muckleshoot Indian tribe shall select replacements if needed due to their represen-
4 tative's resignations.


5 D. All committee members shall be subject to the disclosure provisions of
