A MOTION related to the establishment of a DNA identification system in King County; establishing and approving the membership of the DNA Identification Program Technical Committee charged with recommending analytical techniques and protocols for the DNA identification system.

WHEREAS, King County Ordinance 8453 establishes a program for the collection, analysis, storage, and use of DNA identification data from persons convicted of sex felonies in King County, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 8453 directs the establishment of a technical committee, composed of scientific, forensic evidence, biomedical ethics, and civil liberties experts recognized in their fields, for the purposes of ensuring that the county uses the best DNA fingerprinting techniques available and that civil liberties are protected, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 8453 directs the technical committee, by September 1, 1988, to recommend to the council those analytical techniques, necessary protocols, methods for destruction of portions of samples not used for identification, and methods of obtaining cell samples that should be used by King County's DNA identification program, and

WHEREAS, the King County medical examiner has submitted the technical committee appointments for council approval, as required by Ordinance 8453;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
