A MOTION directing the King County Executive to conduct a feasibility study concerning the use of photo-radar technology for the purpose of traffic control in King County.

MOTION NO.

WHEREAS, the lawful movement of traffic is important to the health, welfare, and safety of King County citizens, and

WHEREAS, the movement of traffic in excess of posted speed limits is detrimental to the health, welfare, and safety of King County citizens, and

WHEREAS, traffic continues to travel in excess of posted speed limits on several roads in King County, and

WHEREAS, new technology is emerging which may prove to be more comprehensive and cost effective than current methods of traffic enforcement, and

WHEREAS, photo-radar technology is improving traffic safety in other jurisdictions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County executive is requested to conduct a study to determine the feasibility of the use of photo-radar systems or other technologies for the control of traffic in King County.

A pilot demonstration project of the photo-radar equipment may be used, issuing informational letters approved as to form by the prosecuting attorney.

Provided that:

The demonstration project shall not be conducted in Council District No. 9.

This study is to include:

- A. Determination of the legality under current Washington state law of any technology considered.
- B. Recommendation whether any of the technologies considered should be implemented in King County.
- C. Criteria used to make the recommendation including the cost effectiveness of the technology under consideration .versus existing methods of traffic enforcement.
- D. Assessment of legislation or other actions required to implement any of the recommended traffic control technologies in King County,

The King County executive is directed to conduct this study within existing resource levels and submit the results for review within six months of passage of this motion.
