A MOTION declaring the position of the
County Council on the need for
proportional representation on the
METRO Council.

WHEREAS, the METRO Council Governance Task Force has
recommended a reduced size of the METRO Council of 23 individuals
composed of seven representatives of the county, seven
representatives of the City of Seattle, seven representatives of
the suburban cities, a sewer district representative and a chair.

WHEREAS, King County believes that representative government
requires proportional representation founded on the principles of
one person-one vote.

WHEREAS, the proposed 7-7-7 split violates the principles of
one person-one vote. (Attachment 1 contains the most current
population figures.)

WHEREAS, the composition of the METRO Council should attempt
to fairly represent all its citizens;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County council urges the METRO Council to revise
the Governance Task Force's proposed METRO Council reorganization
so that the composition shall more fairly reflect the principles
of one person-one vote which would result in a Council composed
of eight county representatives, seven Seattle representatives
and six Suburban representatives.
