MOTION No. 7301

A MOTION requesting the King County Natural Resources and Parks Division to prepare a Parks Plan and an Open Space Action Plan and describing their scope.

WHEREAS, the 1985 King County Comprhensive Plan recognized the need for a functional plan to implement its parks and open space policies, and

WHEREAS, continued development in unincorporated areas of King County has increased the need for conserving open spaces to maintain the region's natural beauty and provide for the outdoor recreation needs of a growing population, and

WHEREAS, the natural resources and parks division's 1987 assessment of King County park needs identified areas of the county significantly underserved by active recreation parks, and

WHEREAS, the draft open space plan identifies the elements of a county-wide open space system and identifies strategies for creating this system;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

- A. The department of parks, planning and resources is requested to develop a parks plan which considers and addresses:
- 1. An overview of adopted policies which affect parks and an inventory of existing county and non-county parks available to county residents.
- The extent to which each community planning area in King County is adequately served by active recreation parks according to the adopted acreage/population standards and the adopted facility/population standards of the county,
- The appropriateness of the acreage standards for neighborhood parks, community parks and major urban parks, and the appropriateness of the facility/population standards,

- 4. Possible amendments to the adopted standards,
- 5. Possible policies to guide the county's involvement with special purpose or regional parks,
- 6. Possible policies to govern how, and under what circumstances, the county funds or operates parks within incorporated areas,
- 7. The identification of specific opportunities within each underserved community planning area for providing sufficient active parks, and
- 8. Strategies for acquiring, developing and operating the additional park facilities needed.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED:

- B. The department of parks planning and resources is requested to develop an open space action plan which considers and addresses:
- 1. The ultimate scope and configuration of the open space system envisioned by the Draft Open Space Plan,
- 2. The extent to which each open space strategy identified in the plan will contribute to the creation of this system,
- 3. The method and timing of implementation of these strategies,
- 4. A prioritization of strategies including an acquisition schedule and a capital development schedule for open space lands, and
- 5. The identification of funding needs for implementation of these strategies and of potential funding sources.
- 6. Revisions to the Open Space Site Evaluation System and Resource Rating Criteria to include:
 - a. Definitions of the open space attributes, and
- b. Provisions addressing the special circumstances of the urbanized areas of the county.
- c. Administrative guidelines for determining the requirements of single-benefit open space sites, and

- Administrative guidelines for determining if a potential acquisition is threatened by development or is likely to be within a reasonable time period.
- A program of incentives for landowners who provide special public amenities by undertaking exceptional preservation measures. Such actions are contemplated to be beyond those required in the development process to protect environmentally sensitive features pursuant to the State Environmental Policy Act or to protect public safety.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED:

C. A work plan for developing this Parks Plan and this Open Space Action Plan should be submitted by February 15, 1989 to the Council for review.
