## MOTION NO. ↑ 7302

A MOTION directing the Department of Parks, Planning and Resources to develop a transfer of development rights program for implementation through the community planning process.

WHEREAS, King County has adopted policies in the Comprehensive Plan to protect the county's natural beauty, open space, environmentally sensitive features, historic features, rural and resource areas, and quality of life by guiding the overall pattern of growth and the development of specific sites, and

WHEREAS, a mix of development incentives and land use regulations is desirable to achieve these policy goals, and

WHEREAS, a transfer of development rights (TDR) program is a development incentive that may achieve these goals while providing public and private benefits, and

WHEREAS, Community Plan updates are currently underway in the Soos creek, Northshore and East Sammamish Community Planning Areas, and

WHEREAS, these community planning areas may contain lands that are appropriate for the application of a TDR program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. The department of Parks, Planning and Resources shall develop a transfer of development rights program for council consideration that accomplishes the following purposes:
- 1. Identifies criteria for transferring densities that include:
- a. identification of areas where specific public benefits will be derived from their protection; and

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- b. a method for determining the amount of public benefit received that includes a recognition of existing development restrictions; and
- c. provision for permanent protection of the public benefit derived by means of an easement or dedication to the county or a certified public land trust; and
- d. location policies for transferring areas that provide for public open space benefits to be reasonably related to the areas of increased density.
- 2. Identifies criteria for areas receiving the increased densities that include:
- a. the presence of existing or planned infrastructure that will accommodate additional density; and
- b. assurance of resulting density consistent with comprehensive plan designations; and
- c. appropriate protection measures providing for continuation of the environmental quality within the area; and
- d. location policies for receiving areas that provide for public open space benefits to be reasonably related to the areas of increased density.
- 3. Provides for density increases that are proportional to the public benefits received and for equitable treatment of small and large properties.
- 4. Provides an implementation program, through the community planning process, that includes a mechanism to ensure that the transfer of development rights is balanced with other existing community plan policies and goals and a review process to adjust permitted density to the specific constraints of a particular site.

- 5. Provides a process for involving King County residents, land owners, cities and other government agencies and conservation and sports groups in the identification of lands of regional significance where specific public benefits will be derived from their protection through the transfer of density.
- 6. Provides a process giving local residents a substantial role in the identification of lands of local significance where specific public benefits will be derived from their protection through the transfer of density.
- B. The executive shall submit a budget proposal which provides for development and transmittal of a transfer of development rights program by April 1, 1989 in order to permit its use in the community plan updates underway at that time.
- C. Upon adoption of this motion the citizen advisory committee of any community plan update then underway shall be provided with information on the transfer of development rights concept and shall consider, throughout its deliberations, the impacts of possible county adoption of such a program.
