6 A MOTION authorizing the County Executive to make a grant  
7 application for funds in the approximate amount of \$25,000 to  
8 support a solid waste enforcement program, Grant File No.  
9 819.

10 WHEREAS, the practice of illegal dumping of waste materials causes potential  
11 health hazards from rodents and insects and potential contamination of ground  
12 and surface waters, and

13 WHEREAS, the Hazardous Waste Clean-up Act, RCW 70.105B., as amended, pro-  
14 vides for the award of grants by the Department of Ecology for the control of  
15 wastes, and

16 WHEREAS, the Solid Waste Enforcement Program will assist the county to  
17 enforce the Board of Health rules and regulations against unlawful dumping of  
18 waste materials and to protect the environment from potentially hazardous waste  
19 materials which are not safely disposed of, and

20 WHEREAS, the council of King County recognizes an obligation to provide the  
21 amount of \$28,002 in support of the project;

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

23 A. The King County executive is hereby authorized to make application for  
24 funds in the approximate amount of \$ 25,000 to the Department of Ecology for a  
25 Solid Waste Enforcement program on behalf of King County;

26 B. The King County executive is hereby authorized to file and execute  
27 such application and to enter into and execute such contracts as are required by  
28 the grantor;

29 C. The King County executive is also authorized to enter into and  
30 execute such subcontracts as are necessary for the implementation of the  
31 project;

D. The Department of Ecology is hereby assured of full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act.
