A MOTION to insure the preservation of green spaces, green belts and trails through the establishment of a county-wide citizen committee to assist in evaluating critical parcels and trail rights-of-way for inclusion in a bond proposition to be placed on the November 1989 ballot.

WHEREAS, King County will grow by an additional 300,000 people by the year 2000, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to maintain our quality of life through the preservation of green belts, green spaces and trails as we accommodate the growth, and

WHEREAS, an effective means of preserving green belts, green spaces and trails is through their purchase by a voter approved bond, and

WHEREAS, green spaces, green belts and trails in Ordinance No. 8551 located in the suburban cities and unincorporated King County have been recognized as critical for preservation and public access and warrant serious reconsideration for public acquisition, and

WHEREAS, the need for regional green spaces, green belts and trails also has been recognized as a major public need, and

WHEREAS, informed citizen involvement will be an effective means of assisting in the evaluation of suitable green belts, green spaces and trails;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A county-wide committee composed of citizens and representatives from the city of Seattle, suburban cities and unincorporated King County shall be established.

- B. Upon consultation with the mayor of Seattle, mayors of the suburban cities and the King County executive, the committee members and committee chair shall be appointed by the King County council and shall be charged with specific directives and criteria for preservation of green belts, green spaces and trails by motion on or before November 15, 1988.
- C. The role of the committee shall be to develop and implement a process for review of the parcels and trail rights-of-way identified in ordinance no. 8551 as well as new possibilities for inclusion from the unincorporated King County, suburban cities or the city of Seattle.
- D. The committee shall be staffed by the King County council staff in consultation with the department of parks, planning and eesources.
- E. The committee shall submit by March 1, 1989 its findings to the county council for review and consideration for inclusion in a green belts, green spaces and trails bond to be placed on the ballot in November 1989.
