A MOTION authorizing the County Executive to make two grant applications for funds in the approximate amount of \$86,250 to support household hazardous waste control programs, Grant Files Nos., 826 and 827.

WHEREAS, the control of household hazardous wastes through collection and disposal or recycling is a county responsibility, and

WHEREAS, an examination of the problems and opportunities arising from discarded household batteries and their safe disposal or recycling would assist the county in determining its future course of action in treating heavy metals contained in the waste flow, and

WHEREAS, the collection of household hazardous wastes in the less populous areas of the county would be facilitated by the employment, on a trial basis, of a mobile collection facility where the public can deliver waste materials for safe disposal, and

WHEREAS, the Hazardous Waste Cleanup Act, R.C.W. 760.105B.220(4), as amended, provides for the award of grants by the Department of Ecology for programs for the collection, disposal and recycling of household hazardous wastes, and

WHEREAS, the council of King County recognizes an obligation to provide the amount of \$86,250 as a required cash match in support of these two programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. The King County executive is hereby authorized to make applications to the Department of Ecology for funds in the approximate amount of \$36,250 for a household battery collection and recycling program, and for \$50,000 for a mobile collection facility program on behalf of King County;
- The King County executive is hereby authorized to file and execute such application and to enter into and execute such contracts as are required by the

grantor: C. The King County executive is also authorized to enter into and execute such subcontracts as are necessary for the implementation of the project; D.
