WHEREAS, the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. believed that liberty, justice and freedom were the 'inalienable rights' of all men, women and children regardless of race, color or creed, and

WHEREAS, the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. believed in the dignity and self-worth of every individual, and subsequently, gave his life defending his beliefs, and

WHEREAS, on February 24, 1986, the King County Council set forth the historical basis for redesignating King County in honor of the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and

WHEREAS, the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. through his persistent and unfailing efforts prompted passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the Voting Rights Act of 1965, both of which have benefited all citizens of this nation, and

WHEREAS, the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. inspired people and nations worldwide to strive in a nonviolent manner for the human rights, civil liberties and economic guarantees rightfully due to people of all races, and

WHEREAS, the citizens of King County shall be reminded on Monday, January 16, 1989, the birthdate of the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., the constitutional tenet of the 'unmitigated pursuit' of life, liberty and happiness for which many citizens of this country have given their lives as a supreme sacrifice to defend;
