MOTION NO. 7432

A MOTION declaring Council intent to seek relocation assistance for displaced mobile home park residents and passage of state legislation; requesting Executive action and interlocal cooperation to preserve affordable housing opportunities.

WHEREAS, seventy-two mobile home parks containing approximately 5,100 homes are located in unincorporated King County, and

WHEREAS, twelve mobile home parks containing nearly one thousand homes have been constructed in unincorporated King County since 1984, and

WHEREAS, King County permits development of mobile home parks within a Residential Mobile Home Park (RMHP) zone, which provides a density bonus of up to 1.5 times the residential density of surrounding properties, a maximum of nine dwelling units per acre, and

WHEREAS, many older mobile home parks are located on land zoned for multiple purposes, and landowners can receive a better economic return for land uses other than mobile home parks, and

WHEREAS, residents in mobile home parks or manufactured housing parks throughout King County both in incorporated and unincorporated communities face displacement due to land use changes, and

WHEREAS, the cost of moving and installation of a mobile home at a different site is \$3,000 to \$5,000, and

WHEREAS, owners of manufactured housing units in mobile home parks tend to be either first time homebuyers or older persons seeking retirement residences who have low or moderate incomes, and

WHEREAS, although recent surveys of county residents by the department of parks, planning, and resources indicate that homeownership is highly valued, relatively high housing costs in recent years have put home purchases beyond the reach of many low and moderate income households, and

WHEREAS, in 1981 the typical price for a double-wide manufactured home of 1,152 square feet (including land, transportation from factory to site, and set-up) was \$31,690 making manufactured housing relatively affordable, and

WHEREAS, the 1989-91 Housing Assistance and 1989 Annual Action Plan report that the present average sales price of houses in King County is \$110,000, and

WHEREAS, the annual income required to finance such a home, assuming a 10% downpayment and a 10.5% conventional mortgage, is \$36,272, which clearly exceeds the King County median income of \$28,950, and

WHEREAS, according to the federal government more than one-third of all new homes sold in the United States in 1981 were manufactured homes, and

WHEREAS, federal legislation now provides for a national, uniform set of construction and safety standards to which all manufactured homes must be built, and

WHEREAS, manufactured housing is permitted on any residential lot in unincorporated King County and, since 1984, 73 percent of manufactured housing permits were for individual lots versus 27 percent for units in parks;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The executive is requested in cooperation with other appropriate local jurisdictions to evaluate county-owned parcels and privately-owned properties for potential replacement mobile home parks and make recommendations to the council within sixty days.

- 1. Residents of Vista Lane and Issaquah Trailer Court shall be offered the first opportunity to apply for available space in such a replacement park.
- 2. Any replacement park developed to address mobile home park displacement must provide long-term security for mobile home owners. Such a park ((shall)) should be controlled by the tenants or a public agency and development conditions ((should)) shall restrict park conversion to other uses.
- B. The council intergovernmental relations staff is directed to seek passage of state legislation during the 1989 Legislative Session providing relief for displaced mobile home or manufactured housing tenants, including but not limited to provision of adequate notice of eviction and relocation assistance and development of replacement mobile home parks.
- C. The county executive is requested to work with manufactured housing unit owners, renters, and manufactured or mobile housing park owners to develop specific solutions for council consideration within 60 days to be implemented when mobile home parks are closed due to changes in land use.
- D. The county executive is requested to include as an element of interlocal agreements between suburban cities and the county, pursuant to the Comprehensive Plan, provisions including but not limited to the protection of manufactured housing units and for relocation assistance for persons displaced by changes in land use.
- E. The county executive is requested to review land use designations for all existing manufactured housing parks and make recommendations to the council within six months.
- F. The county executive is requested to investigate and recommend to the council sources of funding available to assist persons displaced from mobile home parks as a result of changes in land use.

- The county executive is requested to investigate and recommend to the council within ninety days whether there is a need to exercise substantive authority relative to King County Code Chapter 20.44 Environmental Procedures, to ensure displacement of housing tenants of mobile home parks is a significant action under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA).
- The executive, in cooperation with the assessor and Η. council staff, is requested to inventory and monitor the status of mobile home parks in King County and seek the cooperation of incorporated jurisdictions in reporting such information.
