A MOTION related to Adult Detention; establishing a relationship between the Washington State Department of Corrections and King County for the exchange or transfer

of prisoners.

WHEREAS, the department of corrections is given the responsibility under RCW 72.09.050 for the administration of adult correctional programs, and

WHEREAS, King County has been given the responsibility under RCW 70.48.090 and 70.48.180 for the administration of county jail facilities, and

WHEREAS, Chapter 39.34 RCW, the Interlocal Cooperation Act, allows public agencies of state and local government to join together to exercise any power or powers, privileges or authority which each possesses, and

WHEREAS, Initiative 62 requires that the State of Washington provide financial assistance to local governments for additional burdens placed upon local government by the state, and

WHEREAS, RCW 72.09.300 gives the authority to county councilmembers to create a local community corrections board and as King County Motion 7269 creates such a board, and

WHEREAS, Washington State and King County desire by common action to maximize the use of existing resources and to provide adequate facilities and programs for the confinement and care of offenders, and

WHEREAS, the Washingon Intrastate Corrections Compact establishes a cooperative relationship between the state and counties for the exchange or transfer of offenders;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The Washington Intrastate Corrections Compact between the State Department of Corrections and King County establishing a relationship between the Washington State Department of Corrections and King County for the exchange or transfer of prisoners is approved.

PROVIDED THAT:

The agreement is amended to require a definition of "offender days" which counts "offender days" of King County and the State of Washington inmates equally.

PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

The agreement is amended to recognize the obligation of the State of Washington to King County under Initiative 62 and provides for the state to credit King County for the prisoners held by King County resulting from state law changes since the passage of Initiative 62.
