MOTION NO. 7497

A MOTION amending the King County legislative agenda, urging the state legislature to pass legislation implementing economic diversification strategies.

WHEREAS, per capita income from federal department of defense and department of energy spending in Washington state is among the highest in the country, totaling approximately \$6 billion annually, and accounting for approximately one job in eleven in the state, and

WHEREAS, due to federal budget deficits, significant increases in the military budget in recent years are unlikely to be sustained, and

WHEREAS, the state has experienced severe unemployment and business losses during prior federal defense spending cuts, such as the Boeing Bust in the early 1970s and the recent job losses at the Lockheed shipyards, and

WHEREAS, the Washington state legislature appropriated \$40,000 in 1988 to analyze the likely economic impact of military spending cuts on local communities and to recommend strategies to prepare for diversification into civilian industries, and

WHEREAS, King County appropriated \$40,000 for 1989 to identify industries and job categories at risk for spending cuts and to involve the community in planning for diversification, and

WHEREAS, skilled labor and productive businesses throughout
Washington state and King County would benefit from retraining and
business assistance programs designed to assist with
diversification, and

WHEREAS, the economic vitality of the community is the concern of all its citizens, including business, labor, government, education and community groups;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
King County council urges the Washington state legislature to
continue its work in planning for diversification in preparation
for likely military budget cuts.

- A. The state legislature is urged to implement diversification strategies so that programs will be in place to provide assistance when needed.
- B. The state legislature is urged to involve a broad range of the community in planning and implementing diversification strategies, including business, labor, state and local government, education, church, peace and other community groups.
- C. The King County intergovernmental relations staff is directed to work for passage of legislation implementing economic diversification strategies.
- D. The King County legislative agenda is amended to include economic diversification legislation as a county priority.
