A MOTION reaffirming the King County legislative agenda and expressing support for proposals before the State Legislature to provide new and enhanced revenue sources to fund transportation improvements in King County.

WHEREAS, the State Road Jurisdiction Study identified a funding shortfall of \$20 billion for statewide transportation needs, and

WHEREAS, King County has established an average shortfall of \$25 million per year through the year 2000 to address transportation needs in unincorporated King County, and

WHEREAS, those transportation needs that must be addressed have been identified as major road maintenance, arterial construction, state highway improvements, HOV facilities, light rail planning and development and transit system improvements, and

WHEREAS, by Motion No. 7409 King County identified increased revenue for transportation as one of its highest priorities for the 1989 legislative session, and

WHEREAS, King County participated in development of the legislation proposed by Washington Citizens for Improved Transportation, which would increase the state gas tax and authorize several local option taxes to finance local transportation needs, transit and rail, and

WHEREAS, the end of the regular legislative session is approaching and several bills that would provide additional revenue remain in the transportation committees of the State Legislature;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

It is urgently requested that the State Senate and House of Representatives approve legislation for the benefit of all citizens of the State of Washington to provide full funding through a combination of a significant increase in the state gas tax, local option taxes and fees, and an increase in Heavy Weight Vehicle fees for a balanced package of transportation improvements to include but not be limited to:

- 1. State Department of Transportation Category "C" projects.
- 2. State Department of Transportation Super Category "C" projects including the First Avenue South Bridge, State Route 520/202 interchange and improvements to State Route 18.
 - 3. The Transportation Improvement Board.
 - 4. H.O.V. facilities and transit system improvements.
 - 5. Development of a regional rail system.
