MOTION NO. __7564

A MOTION requesting the Executive to develop for council approval a program plan and budget providing the basis for a state mental health funding application consistent with recent changes in state law.

WHEREAS, King County administers portions of the publicly funded mental health program pursuant to Chapter 71 of the Revised Code of Washington, and

WHEREAS, over twenty years ago efforts to organize mental health services at the federal level resulted in the deinstitutionalization of the mental health system, based on the assumption that there would be sufficient funding for alternative community-based outpatient and residential services, and

WHEREAS, the state did not adequately fund these alternative community-based services, particularly residential care and crisis intervention alternatives, and many of the outpatient services funded by the state were not adequate by themselves to meet clients' needs, and

WHEREAS, King County has recognized that the current fragmented administration and delivery of services does not provide for optimal results for clients, and

WHEREAS, King County has repeatedly sought the necessary resources and authority to develop a complete system of community-based care, as exemplified by council approval in 1983 of long-range goals and objectives for the county's mental health system, and

WHEREAS, in 1986 the King County council again recognized the critical need for development and reorganization of the mental health system by authorizing an application to the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation to develop a comprehensive system of care for the chronically mentally ill, which unfortunately was not funded, land

WHEREAS, in 1987 regardless of whether new funds could be obtained, the Department of Human Resources began planning the reorganization of existing services in order to develop a more adequate system of community support for mentally ill adults and children most in need and WHEREAS, in September, 1988, the executive proposed and the

WHEREAS, in September, 1988, the executive proposed and the council approved a three-biennia proposal to the state for county management of an expanded and restructured mental health service delivery system, contingent upon enhanced state funding for residential and crisis intervention services, and

WHEREAS, in 1989 the King County executive, King County council, human resources department, human services roundtable, providers, advocates, consumers, and other local governments joined together to successfully lobby the governor and the current legislature to reorganize state funded mental health services on a regional basis and provide more adequate funding, and

WHEREAS, substitute senate bill 5400 signed by the governor on May 3, 1989 encourages the provision of a full range of mental health treatment and rehabilitative services through the creation of regional support networks of mental health treatment and rehabilitative services, and

WHEREAS, substitute senate bill 5400 encourages the development of community-based and county-managed mental health services with adequate local flexibility to assure mentally ill persons at risk of hospitalization access to a continuum of care which minimizes unnecessary hospitalizations, and

WHEREAS, counties are also encouraged to enter into regional support networks which may begin implementation of a complete system, either in 1990 or 1993 and must be fully implemented by July 1, 1995, and

WHEREAS, only counties which have begun implementation of regional support networks may receive enhancement funding, and

WHEREAS, the 1989-91 state budget contains \$30 million for enhancements for regional support networks which by proviso may be given to networks representing no more than two-thirds of the state, and

WHEREAS, King County constitutes a regional network for the purposes of the new legislation, and

WHEREAS, the new legislation provides the county with the opportunity it has been seeking to manage its local mental health program and define its own priorities, and

WHEREAS, the legislature called on counties wishing to be recognized as regional support networks in the 1989-91 biennium to submit their intentions by October 30, 1989 in order to participate in the first round on state funding beginning as early as January 1, 1990, and

WHEREAS, participants in such a reorganized mental health care system will require significant staff analysis of the new state legislation to determine if the state now provides sufficient funding and administrative flexibility, and

WHEREAS, the council as policy maker and the community for which the system is ultimately accountable must evaluate a proposed program plan and budget prior to authoriziation of executive transmittal of a state funding application by October 30, 1989, and

WHEREAS, council and executive staff have discussed the contents of and the schedule for the preparation of this plan and budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. The executive is requested to prepare and submit for council review and adoption a plan consistent with recently enacted state law. The plan shall describe how mental health services will be organized, funded, and operated for the benefit of mentally ill persons in King County including details of the sequence of events to occur during increments of the next three state biennia.
- B. The executive is requested to develop a process for preparing the plan and budget which assures that significant issues are resolved before submittal to the council.
- C. The plan and budget shall be transmitted for council review and consideration by June 30, 1989.
